



To a Recycling station

Manned stations conveniently situated in your municipality, where you can take larger quantities of waste at no cost. Our personnel will gladly assist you, however, to make your trip to an Ekorosk recycling station a pleasant experience, be sure to sort your waste before leaving home. By sorting your waste properly, you will save yourself time and energy.

Our recycling stations will accept the following types of waste: ash, batteries, brushwood and twigs, carton, electrical and electronic waste, end-of-life textiles, energy waste, furniture, glass packaging, hazardous waste, landfill, leaves and grass, metal, paper, plastic packaging, stone material, treated wood, untreated wood, waste from construction sites, washing machines and refrigerators.

NB!
Stop plastic in bio-waste – use paper bags

At every household



Bio waste

- food leftovers, spoiled food
- innards from fish and bones from meat
- fruit and vegetable peelings, eggshells
- coffee grounds and tea bags
- No packaging materials
- pack Biowaste in a paper bag or biodegradable bag
- pack cooking oil and soups in a milk carton and close up with tape



NOTE! An additional fee for incorrectly sorted biowaste will be charged starting 1 January 2027. The biowaste bin will be marked with a red sticker if it contains plastic.



Energy waste

- diapers and sanitary towels
- small plastic items (i.e. tooth-brushes, hairbrushes) no PVC plastic products
- dust and vacuum cleaner bags
- dirty, mouldy and damp textiles (except shoes, rain- and leather garments)
- paper tissues and napkins
- dog waste, cat litter and pet bedding



At apartment buildings with 5 or more apartments



Carton packaging

- empty cardboard packaging from the household
- cardboard boxes
- beverage cartons, e.g. milk and juice cartons
- cardboard containers, e.g. cereal packets, pizza boxes, egg cartons
- paper bags and sacks
- toilet and kitchen roll tubes
- flatten cartons before sorting, so that more can fit into the waste bin



Plastic packaging

- empty plastic packaging from the household such as yoghurt pots, butter tubs and packaging for cold cuts, cheese, ready meals, take-away food packaging and single-use cups
- plastic bottles, cans and jars, preferably flattened, such as shampoo and soap packaging
- plastic bags, pouches and polystyrene packaging
- empty and dry plastic medicine and vitamin packaging (Note! Unused medicines must be returned to a pharmacy)
- take the container to a recycling station if it contains hazardous residues or is pressurised (e.g. paint, chemicals, oil, hairspray)



Metal packaging

- empty household metal packaging and small metal items
- tins, non-deposit beverage cans, metal lids and caps
- aluminium trays and foil
- empty paint tins
- empty aerosol cans
- metal coffee capsules
- take the container to a recycling station if it contains hazardous residues or is pressurised (e.g. paint, chemicals, oil, hairspray)



Glass packaging

- empty glass packaging, with caps and lids removed
- glass bottles
- glass jars
- rinse dirty glass containers with cold water or wipe with paper
- no need to remove labels and bottles neck rings
- take the container to a recycling station if it contains hazardous residues or is pressurised (e.g. paint, chemicals, oil, hairspray)



Paper and batteries



Paper

- newspapers and magazines
- flyers, brochures
- softcover books
- copying paper and pads of paper
- envelopes

Paper is collected at apartment buildings, ecopoints and recycling stations.



Batteries

- all kinds of household batteries
- small batteries for mobile phones and other electrical equipment
- tape over the terminals when removing the battery from the device
- do not place plastic bags in the battery container
- batteries are collected at ecopoints, recycling stations and in stores that sell batteries.

NOTE! Do not put batteries in household energy waste, as they will cause fires during handling.
